

A Shot To Remember: DIY Kit



The Shot To Remember do it yourself kit included a large 12 x 12 inch piece of 1.25" thick recycled ballistic security glass recovered from a decommissioned high security building. Then water-jet cut to be used in these limited edition kits.

Simply: You shoot the ballistic security glass with your firearm and place it on the wood plaque. Creating a one of kind unique trophy to set in your desk or bookshelf.

INCLUDES:


- 1 - Ballistic Security Glass*
- 1 - Beveled Wood Plaque
- 1 - NRA 50 Foot Pistol Target
- 1 - Brass Name Plate
- 2 - Brass Screws
- 4 - Black Felt Self Adhesive Tabs


STEP 1

If desired, paint or stain the wood plaque whichever way you see fit. Then let it dry.




STEP 2

Place the four felt tabs to the bottom of the plaque to protect the surface of whatever you set it on.



STEP 3

Engrave your personal message on the brass plate. Then place it on the wood plaque, and use the brass screws to attach it.




STEP 4

The ballistic security glass has a paper target taped into it. Take the ballistic security glass to an acceptable shooting range. Following all appropriate safety precautions, then shot the target.

CAUTION: Bullets can ricochet (bounce) off ballistic security glass! Bullets and/or the ballistic security glass could also fragment sending dangerous projectile back at you. This ballistic security glass is not in a supportive solid frame and is recycled condition. Each bullet strike will cause both visible and invisible microfractures in the ballistic security glass. Multiple shots could lead to the ballistic security glass cracking or exploding into pieces. The ballistic security glass is recycled so we can not give it a "rating" to what caliber(s) it will stop. We suggest a medium caliber handgun (38 Special, 9mm, etc.).

ALWAYS PROCEED WITH EXTREME CAUTION!



STEP 5

Remove the tape and paper target from the ballistic security glass and wipe down it down with a wet soft cloth (never clean with ammonia or acetone). Then place it on your wood plaque!
